- In what way was Golda Meir's African project such an important part of her expression of Zionism?
- When the Agranat Commission cleared Golda Meir of wrongdoing, she still resigned after it was released. Do you admire her for this or disagree with her decision?
- What do you think Golda Meir could have done differently for the Mizrahi community, if anything, and why?
